1. Create a new account or login to your account using your previous details from last years' show entries or any other show that uses Show Day Online
2. Select the Myrtleford Show
3. Click on PLACE AN ENTRY
4. Click on INDIVIDUAL ENTRY
5. In Entrant Name select your Entrant from the drop down or click on ADD NEW to add a new entrant to your account
6. If clicking Add New fill out your Entrants name. Other fields are optional
7. In EXHIBIT TYPE select HORSES & CATTLE
8. Click on SELECT CLASSES
9. From the drop down choose what you would like to enter
10. On the pop up tick the box to accept the entry notes for this section
11. Click the PLUS symbol beside the section you are entering to expand to the classes
12. Click on the class or classes you are entering to select them
13. If entering multiple items into the same class, increase the QTY counter to reflect the number you would like to enter
14. Fill out the items name in the Exhibition Name box if applicable e.g. painting name and any other fields as asked
15. ONCE ALL CLASSES HAVE BEEN SELECTED
16. Click on ADD ANOTHER ENTRY if you need to place more entries for this show and repeat this process.
17. Click on FINISHED ADDING CLASSES if you do not need to place any more entries for this show.
18. On the next screen select do not select any 'extra items'. These are not relevant to The Myrtleford Show competitions.
19. Click on FINISHED ADDING EXTRAS once done.
20. Tick the box to agree to our website T&C's
21. Click on the payment type and enter any payment details as required
22. Click on PAY NOW and follow the payment options.

Regulations

- Exhibitors must complete an entry form and sign waiver – for anyone under 18 years on day of show a parent/guardian must sign these forms.
- The organizing committee reserves the right to cancel any class or competition; divide any class; alter times; refuse any entry with or without stating the reason.
- Myrtleford & District A & P Society does not accept any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, riders, ground spectators or any other person or property.
- Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased, dangerous or injured the committee reserves the right of removing the same and refusing admittance to the Show.
- No CLASS event will be held for exhibitors competing in another rings.
- No refunds will be given on any entries, without a medical certificate.
- Breed Sections – All horses and ponies must be registered with their respective Breed Society. Owners must be financial members. Classes will run under their respective society rules.
- Miniature Ponies, Miniature, Little and Small Horses and Dilutes may be registered with any relevant society.
- All breeding dates are as of the 1st of August in each year for horses and ponies.
- Show Hunter Classes – Show Hunter Hack, Galloway and Ponies have more substance than the modern riding pony but still maintain quality. They are expected to move freely at all paces. They may at any time be expected to gallop for the Judge. They are not expected to jump. For more information on Hunter Horses and rider turnout, please visit www.hunterhorses.com.au
- An exhibitor can only complete in either Open or Show Hunter, NOT BOTH.
- Stallions must be exhibited in led & ridden classes by person's 18 years & over. Exceptions: Ridden Shetland & Welsh Mountain Stallions with written parental consent to the show committee.
- Exhibitor's age is taken as on the day of this show.
- A novice horse or pony has not won a first prize at an agricultural show.
- It is encouraged that Parents / Guardians take full responsibility and care of ALL children around horses & ponies.
- Pony Club uniform is acceptable for all events at this show.
- All riders must wear protective headgear to the current Australian standard. The retaining harness must be secured & fastened at all times. Riders without approved headgear shall be ineligible to compete until rectified. This rule applies to all events, not just age competitions.
- No competitors will compete unless a waiver has been signed.
- Random drug testing may occur and disciplinary action taken.
- No exercising on the main arenas.
- Myrtleford & District A & P Society have a strict policy in regard to inappropriate behaviour/bullying. Offenders will be reported to VAS Ltd.
- Any person insulting or interfering with the judges during the Show may be subject to removal from the grounds.
- Any disputes must be taken to the Secretary's Office and on payment of \$100 deposit; the dispute will be handled by the Executive Committee. If the compliant is proved the deposit will be fully refunded.
- If any exhibitor/owner is found to be exploiting and posting derogatory or negative messages / posts on any social media platform will be dealt with harshly and legal action will occur.
- By competing exhibitors consent to having photographs taken during the Show which may be used by the Myrtleford & District A & P Society for promotional and publicity purposes in all types of media.
- Exhibitors may compete in the Fun Ring after the Pony Club classes.
- Camping is available on Friday 25th October for a fee of \$20 per person.
- Gate entry must be paid to enter the Showgrounds on Show Day.

If there's a flood, fire or disease outbreak we may need to contact you. Having a Property Identification Code (PIC) for your property means we can. By law, if you keep horses, you need a PIC.

It's quick and free to get a PIC. Register now at www.agriculture.vic.gov.au/horsepic

AGRICULTURE VICTORIA

A SIMPLE STEP FOR A SPECIAL FRIEND

Having a Property Identification Code (PIC) is a simple way to give your horse an extra level of protection during emergencies. If there's a flood, fire or disease outbreak, Agriculture Victoria may need to contact you. Having a PIC means they can reach you quickly.

So, what does a PIC do? A PIC is an eight-character code specific to where your horse is located. Once registered, the information you supply to the PIC database provides Agriculture Victoria with an understanding of where animals are and, importantly, who to contact in relation to those animals.

Katrina Routson is one of Australia's largest Friesian horse breeders, and owner of Terarossa Lodge in Warmambool. Being a leader in the industry, Katrina appreciates the importance of having a PIC. "If a bushfire comes through someone would know that we have animals," she says. "It's good peace of mind for the disease, bushfire, or even for floods." In addition to vital information during emergencies, PICs also provide an excellent way to provide key updates from Agriculture Victoria to horse owners.

Having a PIC is a legal requirement for properties with horses. It is important to update your PIC in certain instances such as selling your home, or changing your phone number or email address. Up-to-date details are essential during emergencies.

If your horses stay on an agistment property, that property will require a PIC. That's why, before sending your horses for agistment, you should ask the service provider if they have a PIC for the property.

Getting a PIC is quick, easy, and free. All you need is your contact information, the number of horses you keep, and the parcels of land where your horses are being kept.

- Gear Check: Required for all riders before competing as per the current PCA Gear Rules. The responsibility to ride in the correct competition gear remains with the competitor. Elimination may occur if any judge or official discovers a competitor riding with incorrect competition gear. A whip if carried must not exceed 75cm.
- Dogs must be kept on leads at all times.
- No stallions, colts or rigs.
- PCV No smoking and alcohol policies apply.
- No lungeing.

Good Hands Challenge Trophy

Open to girls and boys aged 10 years and under 15 years on the day of the Local Show

Rules & Regulations – Local Show

1. The VAS Good Hands Challenge Trophy is open to boys and girls aged 10 years and under 15 years on the day of the Local Show.
2. All VAS Affiliated Shows are invited to hold the qualifying competitions. Show societies are encouraged to run one class at the Local Show which includes girls and boys.
3. The competitors shall be judged solely on their riding ability - mount, saddlery or costume will not be taken into account.
4. Special attention will be paid to hands and seat, general management and control of the horse or pony.
5. Competitors must ride using an ordinary snaffle, single jointed in the centre. The mouthpiece must be smooth and made of the same type of metal, with or without a cavesson on the noseband.
6. A gear check may take place.
7. Please note straight bar snaffle, drop nosebands, whips and spurs are not allowed.

Rules & Regulations – State Final

1. The VAS Good Hands Challenge Trophy is conducted at the VAS Saddle Horse Championships as one class for girls and boys.
2. No entry fee will be charged but the entrant must fill out VAS Saddle Horse Championships entry form.
3. The VAS 'Good Hands Challenge Trophy' Competition shall be judged on the same basis as the qualifying competitions, but the Judge shall require: Five Finalists to execute a figure 8 at a canter, ride away from the Judge, return at a slow canter, stop at the Judge's signal and back.
4. Equipment used must be as for the Qualifying Competition as specified above.
5. The names of the winner will be engraved on the perpetual trophy.
6. The winners of the 'Good Hands Challenge Trophy' will be eligible to compete in future years, subject to the age of the competitor.
7. VAS Ltd may, at its discretion, vary the conditions governing the qualifying and Championship Competitions.

Series Qualifier Regulations

1. Open to any thoroughbred horse bred to race that has been stud book registered, either domestically with the Australian Stud Book or Internationally. Registrations will be checked by VAS office.
2. Racing name to be used where appropriate. When entering if name is different to racing name, please provide the following details (if known)
 - Racing name
 - Microchip number
 - Aust ID
 - Dam and Sire
 - Date horse retired
3. Riders to be 12 years and over on day of qualifying Show.
4. Colts/Stallions are not permitted to contest a series qualifier.
5. Qualifying Shows must be VAS Ltd Affiliated.
6. Qualifying classes will be judged ridden.
7. Once a horse has won a ridden qualifier, the horse cannot compete at another ridden show qualifier in that calendar year.
8. All qualifying winners gain automatic entry into the Racing Victoria's Off The Track Ridden Open or Show Hunter Series State Final to be held at the VAS Ltd Saddle Horse Championships.
9. To be judged as a good example of an Off the Track Thoroughbred, (rather than riding horse/hunter types), with the following being taken into consideration:
 - Thoroughbred qualities
 - Conformation
 - Manners, paces and performance
 - Injuries caused through racing such as blemishes are allowed
10. Judge's decision is Final in Qualifiers and State Final.
11. Show Qualifier Prizes: Sash, \$50.00 Prizemoney sent out once qualification has been verified by Racing Victoria (Prize pack collected at State Final).



Series Qualifier Regulations

1. Open to all purebred freeze branded or microchipped Standardbreds registered with Harness Racing Australia. Raced or unraced. Registrations will be verified.
2. Registered/Racing name to be used where available. Freeze brand number or microchip number must be provided.
3. Horse does not need to be registered with any other Association or Breed Society other than Harness Racing Australia to be eligible to compete.
4. Riders to be aged 12 years and over on the day of the Qualifying Show.
5. Colts/Stallions are not permitted to contest a series qualifier.
6. Qualifying Shows must be VAS Ltd affiliated.
7. Qualifying classes will be judged ridden.
8. Once a horse has won a qualifier, the horse cannot compete at another Show qualifier in that calendar year.
9. All qualifying winners gain automatic entry into the Alabar HERO Series Final to be held at the VAS Ltd Saddle Horse Championships.
10. To be judged as a good example of a Standardbred rather than a riding horse/hunter type with the following being taken into consideration:
 - Standardbred qualities
 - Conformation
 - Manners, paces and performance
 - Racing related injuries and/or blemishes are permitted
11. The Judge's Decision is Final in the Qualifiers and State Final.
12. Qualifier Prizes: Sash, \$50.00 Prizemoney sent out once qualification has been verified and HERO Gift Pack (Prize Pack collected at State Final).



VAS Ltd Saddle Horse Championships



Background of the Championships

The VAS Ltd Saddle Horse Championships began in 1996. The VASA committee introduced an event that would not only Showcase champion horses and riders from across Victoria, but in turn increase exhibitor numbers at Agricultural Shows.

The 'Best of the Best' event has grown steadily and is now recognised as a competitor friendly Championships'.

The championships have developed over the years with now holding multiple State Finals at the Championships including the Racing Victoria Off the Track Series, Alabar HERO Series and the Good Hands Challenge Trophy.

Qualifications

The qualifications for the championships are taken from 1st January 2024 to 8th December 2024. For each section there are requirements for qualifications:

Open Classes: 1 Champion or 2 Reserve Champions or 2 First Places at VAS Ltd Affiliated Shows

First Season: Must have attended & competed at 3 VAS Ltd Affiliated Shows

Rider Classes: First Place or 2 Second Places at a VAS Ltd Affiliated Shows
